A little about this singer is listed below:

Scotty McCreery has been a household name for nearly half his life, ever since making history in 2011 as both the first country artist and the youngest male artist of any genre to debut his first studio album, the Platinum-certified Clear as Day, at No. 1 on the allgenre Billboard Top 200 Albums chart. With his latest album Rise & Fall, featuring his sixth No. 1 single "Cab in a Solo," current single "Fall of Summer," and 11 additional tracks, McCreery explores classic themes of heartbreak, rowdy nights, nostalgia, faith, newfound joy, fatherhood, and enduring love, and through it all, felt comfortable being himself, resulting in a project full of electrified twang, rich baritone vocals and insightful storytelling.

The 31-year-old has sold more than 4 million albums and achieved 6 No.1 hits: the recent "Cab in a Solo," the RIAA Platinum-certified "Damn Strait," the RIAA Gold certified "You Time," the RIAA Gold certified "In Between," the RIAA Platinum certified "This is It," and the RIAA Triple Platinum certified "Five More Minutes."

The North Carolina native has earned one Triple Platinum, five Platinum and four Gold singles; one Platinum and two Gold albums; won the 10th season of "American Idol" in 2011 at age 17; was named the ACM New Artist of the Year in 2011; won two CMT Music Awards, the first for Breakthrough Video of the Year ("The Trouble with Girls") in 2012, and the

second for Digital-First Performance of the Year ('It Matters to Her' from "CMT Stages") in 2024; and BMI Awards for writing One of the Top 50 Country Songs of the Year five times (in 2015 for 'See You Tonight', in 2018 for "Five More Minutes," in 2019 for "This is It," in 2021 for "In Between," and in 2022 for "You Time"). He was awarded Pandora Billionaire status in 2021 in recognition of his music achieving more than one billion streams on Pandora. His song "Five More Minutes" inspired two popular holiday movies which aired on the Hallmark Movies & Mysteries Network: Five More Minutes in 2021 and Five More Minutes: Moments Like These in 2022. He released his first book Go Big or Go Home: The Journey Toward the Dream in 2016. Last year McCreery was inducted into the North Carolina Music Hall of Fame. Earlier this year, he was inducted into the Grand Ole Opry by Josh Turner and Randy Travis, after being invited late last year by Garth Brooks.

Other animals that can be found in Madera Canyon include black bear, mountain lion, bobcats, white-tailed and mule deer, foxes, coatis, ring-tailed cats, raccoons, wild turkeys, squirrels, and rabbits. Sixteen species of bats have also been recorded in the canyon".

ATTENTION NM Rally Drifters! We have an exciting new development to share with you regarding the last segment of our Sept/Oct rally, Drifting Through New Mexico. We are currently scheduled to spend the rally's last 4 nights from Sept. 29th to Oct 3rd in Bloomfield, where the rally ends (about 15 miles east of Farmington). We have a great change to this segment.

It turns out that the Rocky Mountain Motorcoach Association (RMMA, an FMCA subgroup) has a rendezvous in Farmington from Oct. 1st to the 5th at the McGee RV Park. Some of our club members, including those at this NM rally, went last year and said they have a great time and want to go again. In fact, several of our rally members have already expressed a desire to attend, including your rally hosts! The RMMA will have fun entertainment, food, socializing, activities, etc.

SO, your hosts have decided to officially end our rally in Chama on Sept. 29th, and those who wish to attend the fun RMMA rally can join us at the

McGee RV Park on Oct. 29th, when we leave Chama. If you do not wish to attend the RMMA rally, you can still meet up with us at the RV park in Farmington if you wish for activities.

The RMMA rally cost is \$285 per couple. Our costs in Bloomfield so far totaled \$300 per couple, so this is the amount that will be deducted from your balance, so your final balance due March 15th will be reduced from \$1,022 to \$722.

This is a win-win situation for our group, as we can still do the daily activities we planned (which were at no cost) and also attend whatever parts of the RMMA rendezvous you wish. In addition, this adds 2 more nights to the rally.

David Ridley, one of our Drifters members, is working on the RMMA rally, and fortunately for us is in charge of parking! I have spoken to him, and he can arrange to have those of us attending the RMMA rally park together as of Oct. 29th, when we leave Chama.



We can park at the McGee RV Park for \$30 a night before the rally starts on Oct. 1st, so we can arrive on the 29th when we leave Chama. Folks can pay \$30 a night each for Sept. 29th and Sept. 30th if they wish, and then the RMMA Rendezvous pays for 4 nights from Oct. 1st to the 5th.

The RMMA Rendezvous application is provided as a separate attachment. You can fill this out and send it to RMMA if you wish to attend.

The other good thing is that since the activities we planned to do in the area have no charge, we can still do these even if you don't attend the RMMA rally. You will have to pay \$30 per night to the RV Park. You can call McGee RV Park directly at (505) 325-5415 and make your site reservations. This also applies to Drifter members who are not on our NM rally but wish to join up with us in Farmington.

The rally does not start until Oct. 1st, so if we want to go to the Aztec Ruins National Monument on Sept. 30th (as we had planned), we can still do so! This is a great spot to see, with an impressive Visitor's Center, film, exhibits, and extensive ruins. In addition, during the rally, we can still see other planned activities, such as the B-Square Ranch (tour planned for Oct 1st), and the Salmon Ruins Historical Archeological Site (very cool!).


